

Walton SpeedWatch team continues to go out regularly monitoring

vehicle speeds and raising awareness about the 30 mph speed limit in Walton. We are occasionally joined by PCSO Tim Richards who advises and supports us. The Speed Enforcement Unit is often in Walton - we see cars, a motorbike and police standing by the roadside. Speed is a problem in every village but we are very well supported here in Walton. Speeding vehicles are reported to the police by the SpeedWatch team and some drivers are visited while others are sent a letter. ALL vehicles details remain on the police database so that persistent offenders are identified.
